Notes

States have historically regulated insurance, and many have mandated minimum benefits for decades. Currently, 30 states require insurance plans to cover contraceptives, with a wide range of coverage and cost-sharing requirements, and exemptions among these mandates. Ten of these states and DC have passed laws expanding the ACA contraceptive coverage provision.

Definitions

Coverage Required for Prescription Contraception: States that require insurance policies that cover prescription drugs to also cover all FDA-approved contraceptive drugs and devices.

N/A: Not applicable. State does not have a contraceptive coverage requirement for insurers that cover prescription drugs.

- 1. The states allow pharmacists to prescribe and dispense contraceptives, but insurance coverage of these services is not explicitly included in the law
- 2. These states exclude the coverage of external condoms
- 3. The states explicitly include coverage for contraception that is prescribed and dispensed by a pharmacist.
- 4. This state only provides coverage to over the counter drugs.
- 5. This state only provides coverage to over the counter condoms.
